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## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Edmonson Home was built prior to 1873, but the architect is unknown. Mrs. Jennie Kendall Dean said her Father, who built Kendall Manor, also built this house, but did not live in it. The Beverlys bought this property from the Edmonson Estate.

During a Thunder storm a visitor to the Edmonson girls, Miss Sallie Mae Craven, had her picture printed on a mirror in the hall. The picture remained for several days and then faded out. She was so intriqued by this experience that in later years as Mrs. Thornton she investigated every report of lightening photography and found two or three more incidents.

Although there is no legend of ghosts during the Beverly residence there seemed to be evidence of ghosts. One night when the two daughters, their husbands and families were visiting, the husband of the elder daughter was asleep in the room adjoining the one where the younger sister and her husband were sitting. Suddenly they heard a noise such as would be made by a dog scratching to get out and the husband aroused from his sleep called out and said he had seen a luminous, grinning face suspended helfway between the ceiling and floor. A night or two later the younger daughter heard yet other unexplained noises, and several months later, another experience which could have been logically explained by the presence of a dog; but there was still no dog.

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
