I have only been able to trace house as follows: IN 1846. property owned by Creek Indians sold to ? unknown persons. Then Pattillo's get property cannot find record when. but occupy house till 1900 then move to Texas, sell house to Mr. Staples, and his daughter. Because of fire of Calhoun County Court house in late 1800's - could only find Tax records starting 1900's.

The house went through a period of neglect. after 1920. It was broken up in apartments and treated badly inside + outside, vandalized. Parts were taken off. In 1950's House was purchased by the Houston family who proceeded to restore it. They added plumbing, elect. 3 New rooms, bathrooms. and modern fixtures.

Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Exterior Located 1 Block off MAIN Street OF the Town OF Oxford ALABAMA, the house Faces East on appx 2 1/2 acres. House sits back from street and has circle driveway in front. House was built appx 1846. The Two story house, with Tin roof is a T shape. The exterior of house is covered with weather board painted white, house has green shutters on front and side windows. House has slave made built for foundation and between inside and outside walls there are the same bricks. Windows are 8 and 6 paned, Old wavy glass. Front door and upper balcony doors and some windows have original hardware and locks. At a later date house has had additions, modern plumbing wiring.

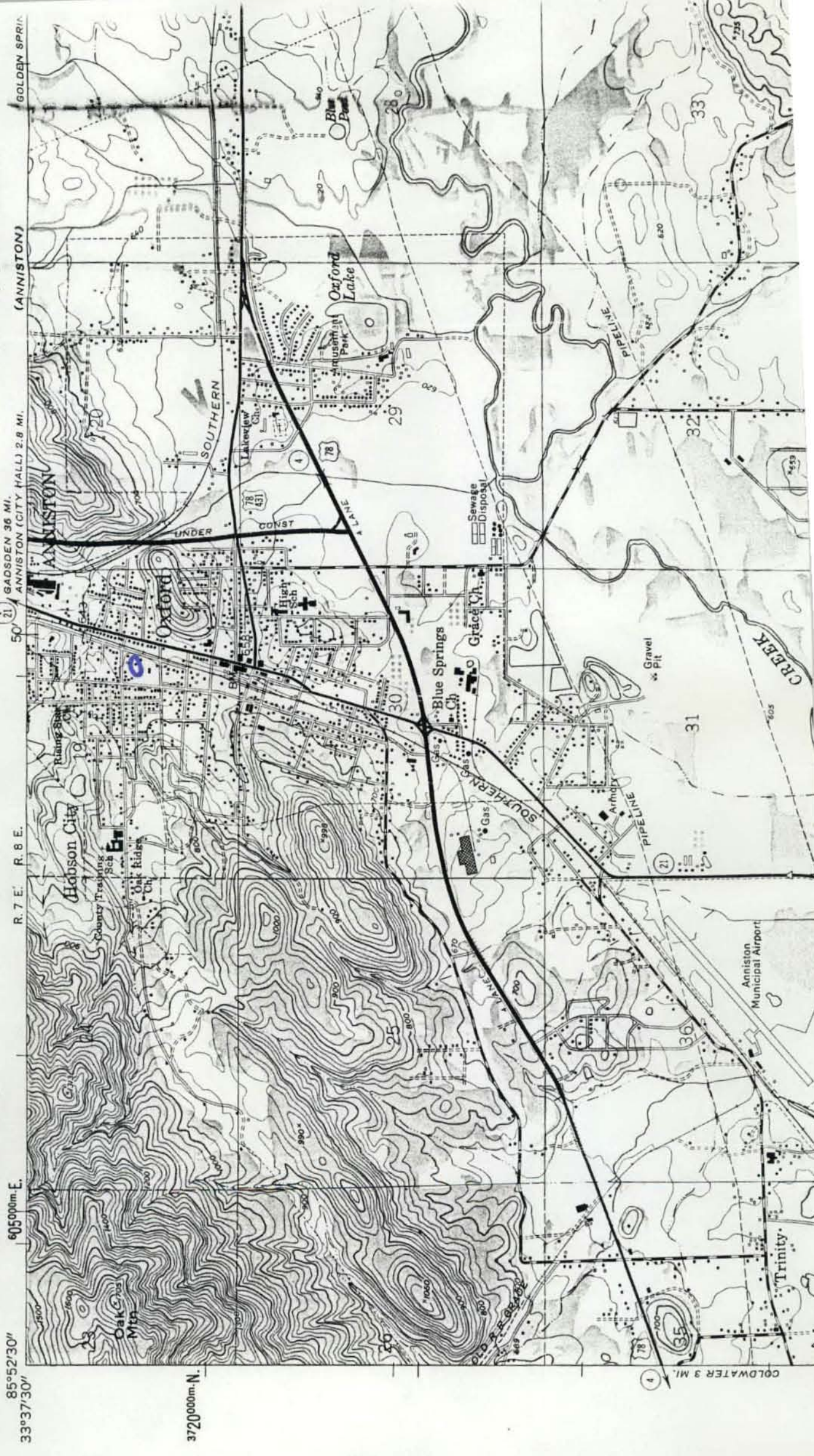
Interior front hall has simple staircase. 3 main rooms downstairs have simple fireplaces and moldings. We did find a quaint little door boarded up in closet that shows these 2 rooms did have entrance way at one time. Ceilings were wooden beaded (have been covered over) also another room which make T downstairs ceilings were 10-12 feet. Have bee lowered. upstairs same lay-out board and batten on walls and ceilings. Pine floors upstairs. We are in process of restoring house to original condition.
