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Ferry site as early as 1895, the ferry was poled across the then narrow stream that was the Coosa River before Lay Dam was built. In 1907 it was known as Adams Ferry. The next mention of it is in 1947 when the land and ferry was deeded to Glennie T. Mims from Oscar L. Mims.

The present ferry was moved here in 1957, from Lake Jordan where the Folsom Bridge was built on Alabama 22. It was then that the counties took over maintainence, before then it had been privately operated.

The boat is made of iron with wooden side rails, a 1947 Ford V-8 propels the ferry across the 1,100 feet of water. It is 72 feet long and weights one ton per foot. It can carry 4 cars at one time.

The Mims ferry sank before 1957, the hull can still be seen.
