



Allen Plantation Alabama Register Nomination Statement of Significance, continued

The Allen family men of Cromwell have fought in many American battles. Men have fought in the American Revolution, War of 1812, Civil War, WWI & II, Korean War, Vietnam, and the Gulf War. The Plantation home as been used as a regular meeting place for the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) and the United Daughters of the Confederacy (UDC).

Allen Plantation is a true treasure for West Alabama and Choctaw County. It has survived many storms such as timber being hit from tornadoes in the summer of 2011. The Allen Plantation has survived and the current owner plans to continue this heritage by doing a complete restoration to the property. The owner plans to level the home, add a new metal roof, new plumbing, replace rotten wood, new electrical wiring, new HVAC ductwork and units, new insulation, new exterior and interior painting, remover sheetrock and preserve the heart pine walls, restore heart pine flooring, and landscaping.

Allen Smokehouse & Shed: heart pine logs (tongue and groove); pine board ceiling; tin roof
