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#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The Tibbie Post Office is eligible for listing on the Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage under Criteria A and C, in the areas of architecture and commerce. With its simulated ashlar pressed tin siding and steel truss-supported porte cochere, the building is an outstanding example of an early-20th century gable-front vernacular commercial building. It maintains a high level of architectural integrity, possessing essentially all of its original elements. Historically, it has served as a central social gathering place, an essential commercial establishment, and, since becoming a post office in the late 1960s, as the only governmental facility in the area. It is currently threatened by neglect due to plans of the U.S.P.S. to vacate the building.

### NOTES ON THE TIBBIE POST OFFICE, WASHINGTON COUNTY

One story gable front wood frame commercial building, seam metal roof, pressed tin siding simulating ashlar, full brick lattice foundation, front hipped porte-cochere with single steel truss support, four over four sash windows (paired on front elevation, small central brick stove chimney, small rear concrete block addition, over shelf transoms on side elevations, exposed rafters under the eaves, fixed wooden louvre vent in front gable, front double door with four narrow panels per leaf, rear door that now leads into concrete block addition is single leaf with five stacked horizontal panels, flush board interior wall cladding, narrow beaded board interior ceiling, original metal plate for stovepipe in ceiling inscribed "McGowin-Lyons Hardware & Supply Co., Mobile, Ala.).

#### History:

Allegedly built early in the twentieth century, the physical presence of the building suggests a 1920s date at its earliest. Originally functioned as a company store for a local large landowning family involved in turpentine manufacture and cattle farming. The building was moved to its current site in the late 1940s or early 1950s. The rear concrete block addition was added in the 1950s. It functioned as a grocery store until one or two years ago, and still functions as the community post office, although this function is endangered by recent consolidations.

SUMMARY:

The Tibbie Post Office is a one-story gable-front wood-frame commercial building located in the rural Washington County community of Tibbie. Constructed during the early 20th century, probably around 1920, it features a simulated ashlar pressed tin siding, a seam metal roof, and a front hipped porte cochere with a single steel truss support. Other original elements include 4/4 wood sash windows, four-paneled double doors, wood floors, horizontal flush board interior wall covering, and narrow beaded board interior ceiling. An original metal stovepipe plate inscribed "McGowin-Lyons Hardware & Supply Co., Mobile" also remains. A concrete block addition dating from the 1950s was attached at the rear.

The building was constructed as a company store for a large landowning family (W.W. Kirkland family) involved in turpentine manufacture and cattle farming. After the improvement of Alabama Highway 17 in the late 1940s led to the re-routing of the road in front of the store, the building was moved approximately 100 yards to its current site. Elderly Kirkland daughters, Misses Gladys Madison and Bessie Dees, continue to maintain ownership of the timber property on which the store is located.

During the late 1960s, the front portion of building was rented to the U.S. Postal Service to accommodate post office boxes, and rural delivery was also provided. This facility replaced an earlier postal building located approximately a quarter-mile away that is no longer extant. For many years, the present structure served as a joint post office and country store, until the store was closed within the past year. The U.S. Postal Service has called upon the owners to make structural improvements to the building, consisting of floor and ceiling repairs and the addition of rest room facilities and a handicapped access. The owners have no plans for these alterations, so the building is rented by the USPS on a monthly basis until a new postal facility is found.
