The is a one-story frame school house in fair condition located in a small rural community.

The Prairie Mission School is located on a cleared level site and faces north onto a dirt road approximately 1/2 mile east of Co. Hwy 28. A curving drive loops off the dirt road and runs in front of the school. A mid-20th-century brick church and brick house are located directly across the dirt road and an early 20th-century frame house associated with the school is just to the east.

The building is basically rectangular in shape with a hipped roof, a square bell tower and an attached gabled front bay; it is covered with lap siding. Two small additions are on the rear or south elevation.

The gabled front bay is centered and extends across 3/4 of the facade. It contains the primary decorative elements of the building. Two double-door entrances with brick/concrete stoops flank two centered windows. Small shed roofs supported by brackets cover the stoops and are surmounted by vertical light transoms. The pedimented gable above contains a triple window with modest decorative trim. The windows are currently covered with plywood.

The east and west elevations are composed of six bays consisting of five windows and one door. All of the windows have been replaced with modern sash smaller than the originals and the openings reduced about 6" in height, though not in width. A small gabled ell extends from the south or rear elevation and contains restrooms; it was probably added in the early 20th century. A smaller shed roof addition contains....?

The interior consists of a large central auditorium that runs the length of the main block and is flanked by two narrow classrooms on either side. Twin vestibules accessed from the entrance doors flank a central room. Originally this space was continuous but was partitioned in the mid-20th century. A low raised stage is located at the southern end of the auditorium. A flight of narrow stairs is recessed into the stage on either side and a similar set gives access to doors opening into the flanking rear classrooms. The room was arranged so that it could be subdivided into class rooms by means of folding wooden doors or curtains hung from center board partition that extends about two feet down from the ceiling. A single column is located in the center of the room provided support. Chimney flues for cast-iron stoves are located on either wall just south of the division. Small windows are located high on the walls and allow light and ventilation from the classrooms and front room to enter the auditorium. Wall and ceiling finishes include 3" beaded vertical wainscoting, flush and beaded horizontal boards, and 1 1/2" beaded siding. Flooring throughout was replaced in the mid-20th century with narrow width oak.

Two dormitories associated with the school were demolished. One was sited just to the east of the school and the other across the dirt road near the current modern dwelling.

CRITERION A: EDUCATION/RELIGION/BLACK HISTORY

The Prairie Mission School is [the last remaining school?] associated with the effort by Presbyterians to provide primary and secondary education for Wilcox County's black children. Constructed during a period when public education was non-existent for blacks and rare for whites, the building reflects the high value Wilcox County blacks placed on education and the efforts of religious groups to provide it. The period of significance begins with the construction of the building and ends in 1941 the arbitrary 50-year time period.

CONSIDERATION A: RELIGIOUS PROPERTIES

The Prairie Mission School is significant for its association with role religious groups had in providing essential social services throughout the 19th and early 20th centuries, and, in particular, the role specific denominations had in providing primary and secondary education for Blacks in Alabama and other southern states.

The Prairie Mission School was established in 1894 by as one of six Presbyterian schools in the county.

The school, which had as many as 300 students in a year, offered instruction in grades 1-9 until the 1950s, at which time students in grades 7-9 were sent to a sister school in Millers Ferry. [Schools were located in Millers Ferry, Camden, Annie Manie].

An extant 1910 class ledger recorded 129 students enrolled.

In addition to the school building, the educational complex included a Presbyterian Church, a fine two-story frame principal's home and two dormitories for boarding students. The church was rebuilt or reworked in the mid-20th century and the two dormitories no longer exist. The principal's residence, which is under separate ownership, appears to be intact and in good condition.

The Presbyterians ceased operating the school in 19xx, and in recent years it has been used as a nutritional center.
