On January 11, 2017 the Alabama Historical Commission launched its newly redesigned website.

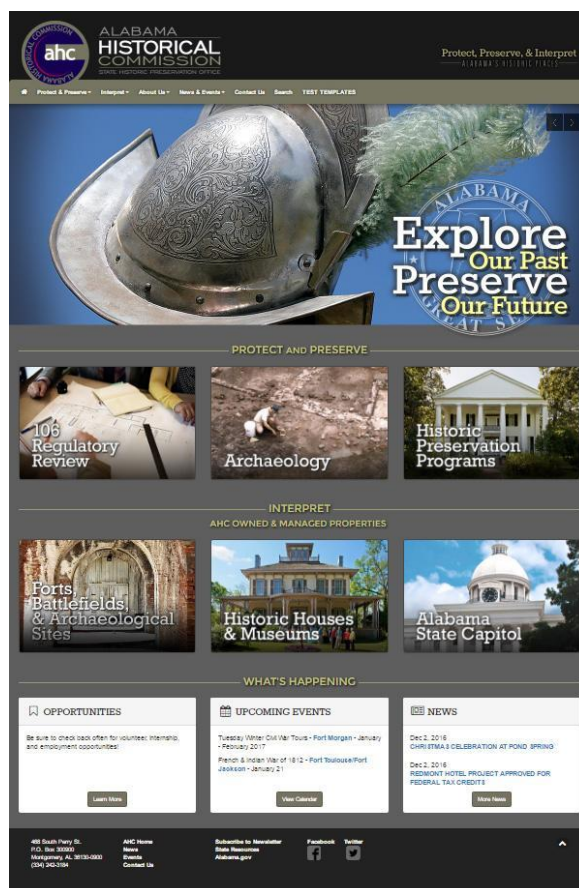
The restyled site provides a cleaner, more user-friendly experience with improved navigation.
