Old Cahawba Receives New Regions Bank Bicycles

Old Cahawba, a historic property of the Alabama Historical Commission, received a delivery of six new Regions Bank bicycles.

Regions Bank, a loyal supporter of Old Cahawba, donated the famous “green bicycles,” which are available for visitors to use to explore the many trails throughout the site.



The initial donation of bikes from Regions Bank was in 2012. In the past 6 years hundreds of people have taken advantage of the free bicycle program at Old Cahawba. This partnership has successfully served to promote recreation, tourism, and preservation within the Black Belt.
