However, the house offers much more and presents our region's complex history. Magnolia Grove was the boyhood home of Spanish-American War hero and U.S. Congressman Richmond Pearson Hobson. The Alabama Historical Commission owns this historic site. The Magnolia Grove Foundation is the support group in charge of operating the site. Magnolia Grove is open Thursday-Saturday, 10:00- 4:00 and is located at the intersection of Main Street and Hobson Street (AL-14) in Greensboro, Alabama.
